### Redakce. DALIBOR ŘÍHÁNEK, PAINTER AND GRAPHIC ARTIST, Part I. (Page 115)

The year 2020 was not favorable for the holding of exhibitions, nevertheless Dalibor Říhánek managed to organize two important exhibitions. The first took place in the Knížecí dvůr Gallery in Hluboká nad Vltavou under the title *Still Creative* in the period from 11 July to 6 August 2020; the opening was introduced by Pavel Frelich, the author and his work were discussed by the gallerist Marie Hanušová, and the author added instructive talk about authors and artists and a little about horses, which often appear in his works. The second exhibition took place in the Municipal Museum and Gallery in Nepomuk entitled *Versatility* in the period from 4 September to 17 October 2020; the exhibition concept was Dalibor Říhánek, curated by Mgr. Svatoslava Kožíková and the architectural solution were undertaken by Miloslava Říhánková.

# Karel Žižkovský. EXHIBITION ON THE 95TH BIRTHDAY OF PAVEL SUKDOLÁK IN THE GALLERY OF HOTEL VILLA IN PRAGUE (Page 117)

The academic painter and graphic artist Pavel Sukdolák, who lived to be ninety-five this year, has not had any annual exhibition of his extensive graphic work realized by the National Gallery, and the author has not modestly requested an exhibition at the Hollar Gallery this year did not apply for an exhibition at the Hollar Gallery this year, so this year's only exhibition of Sukdolák's selected works in the exhibition space of the Villa Hotel has become a real gem for art lovers in this crazy, pandemic-marked time. The opening took place on September 3, 2020, the introductory word was given by the author of this article.

## Jiří Ort. A FEW MEMORIES OF JOSEF KÁBRT TO THE 100th BIRTH ANNIVERSARY

October 14, 1920 - February 7, 1989 (Page 118)

I love his fantastic world with contrasts of good and evil, youth and old age, love and hate, where graceful and ugly figures, melancholic beauties and grimacing imaginary monsters emerge from the veil of imagination. Even how he alternated in his subjects the visions of destruction and lovely nooks for loving rest. Until death, I will not forget his friendly face with glasses and his cordiality and hospitality during our several joint meetings with his wife in a studio in Lomnice full of large canvases painted in vibrant colors. Towards the end of his life, I received from him the Last Greeting - a delicate drawing depicting with touching immediacy the inner drama of a man - an artist who resists insidious diseases and tirelessly creates to the last. From above a gentle portrait of a smiling girl, who is adorned with a linden sprig in her hair, at the bottom in the right corner are two wrinkled and overgrown old men with inquisitive eyes. On the palette, "You have nothing more to do here!" In a few weeks, on February 7, 1989, he had ended his fight. He died at the Hradec Králové hospital at the age of only 68.

# Jiří Ort. ABOUT THE JUBILANT MIROSLAV MATOUŠ (October 7, 1920 - March 8, 1998), this time as a collector of small graphics (Page 122)

Arriving in the North Bohemian metropolis, as a landscape painter, was M. Matouš fascinated by the beauty of the Bohemian Central Mountains, the Děčín Walls and the Elbe Valleys. He processed their themes in color lithography, which became his natural transfer station between painting and graphics. The second, no less important inspiration in his life and work was a woman. With his friend and fellow painter Ladislav Lapáček (1920-1993), he not only had the same year of birth and an apprenticeship certificate from a lithographic school, but above all had a common interest in perpetuating young models in nature in his cozyli studio. The bookplates were gladly exchanged with him by the Austrians dr. Ottmar Premstaller and dr. Norbert Hillerbrandt or the Dutch W. A. P. Zwiers and Jan Souverein. With refined taste, he gathered a collection of magnificent opuses, which he offered to his guests in a modest studio in the basement of a panel house for inspection before his own work.

# Karel Žižkovský. OLOMOUC CONGRESS SIGNED BY PANDEMIA (Page 124)

This year's congress was pleasant, nice and thanks to the organization and venue very clear. After all, most of the guests ran out of the dormitory, crossed the road and a small adjacent park and were already in the new modern building of the Faculty of Science of the University of Olomouc. I, a former geologist, passed nostalgically by the park decoration, which included beautiful, large chunks of interesting rock, then in the corridor leading to the auditoriums, where exchanging was eagerly going on, laughed with taste and a little mischief to the mineral models, and only then I sat down at the table with our publications and papers for exchange. Registration was quiet and refreshments took place in the lobby: delicious cakes, coffee, sandwiches and drinks. According to the list prepared by Mrs. Mgr. Jarmila Špačková the congress in Olomouc attended 49 members of SSPE-collectors, 7 members of SSPE-artists: Petr Hampl, Günter Hujber, Oldřich Jelen, Martin Manojlín, Lubomír Netušil, Miroslav Petřík and Marie Michaela Šechtlová, and as guests Tomáš Hřivnáč and Herbert Kisza. They were accompanied by 20 people, including graphic artists Františka Jelenová and Vlastimil Sobota. In total it was 78 people. No one from abroad came.

### Karel Urban. 38. FISAE CONGRESS, LONDON 2020 (Page 126)

Applications for the congress came mainly from collectors and artists from China and Turkey. Very few applications came from European countries and Russia. Despite the threat of a smaller number of congress participants, which could result in a financial loss, preparations for the 38th FISAE Congress 2020 continued.

Everything seemed to be on track until the arrival of Covid-19. There was a danger of the disease spreading to a larger number of people indoors, so the hotels were closed indefinitely. Like many other events, the 38th FISAE Congress, scheduled for 12-15. August 2020, was canceled after an agreement among The Bookplate Society, FISAE Representatives Anthony Pincott, President FISAE and Congress in London, and Olli Ylönen, FISAE Secretary. The next, the 39th FISAE Congress 2022 will be held in San Francisco, USA.

# Zdeněk Řehák. XVI TRIENNIAL OF CZECH EXLIBRIS 2020 NO LONGER IN CHRUDIM, BUT VIRTUAL (Page 130)

Three years have passed and in 2020 the triennial disappeared from the Chrudim exhibition hall and the traditional SSPE congress did not take place in Chrudim. Most of the culture and exhibitions were destroyed by coronavirus for everyone this year.

And yet another 16th triennial has now appeared - still under the auspices of the Museum of Czech Literature, much more modest, with fewer exhibits from a smaller number of authors and can only be seen on screen - a virtual triennial. Many thanks at least for that! Perhaps the previously proclaimed virtual presentation discouraged many authors from participating. But even so, it is worth looking at the triennials and reading short accompanying texts.

# Martina Vyšohlídová. NATIONAL CELEBRATIONS OF THE ANNIVERSARY OF THE TEACHER OF NATIONS (Page 131)

Of course, the portrait of J. A. Comenius also appears on exlibris. An interesting exlibris was published by Bolzano's independent teacher orphanage, which used the portrait of J. A. Komenský on his universal bookplates twice. One of Otakar Štáfl's workshops with a classic depiction of the bust (P1, 1912) and for the second time with the whole figure by Antonín Brunner (P1, undated).

#### Martina Vyšohlídová. ROOM No. 20.197 (Page 131)

Towards the end of 2020, during the ongoing "covid crisis", the Library of the National Museum managed to open a new exhibition space intended for chamber exhibition projects with an artistic-book-literary focus. Visitors can therefore look forward to exhibitions in the field of book culture, artistic bookbinding's and bibliophiles, and literary-scientific exhibitions.

### Pavel Hlavatý. FROM WORLD COMPETITIONS (Page 132)

The University of Famagusta in Northern Cyprus, in collaboration with the University of Katowice, announced in 2019 an exlibris competition with the theme of Soul.

The Museum of the Polish City Ostrów Wielkopolski has been the announcer of the Exlibris Biennial for two decades. During these years, about 1,200 artists from all over the world passed the competition.
